The Silver Fox Model Railway Club

I suspect most people in Tingewick have not heard of the Silverfox Model Railway Club. Its friendly members come from many areas around Milton Keynes and its surrounding villages and towns including Tingewick and Buckingham.

We have a dedicated clubhouse in Wolverton and meet on Tuesday evenings between 6:30 to 9pm to run our locos on the club railway layouts, exchange ideas and learn from each other.

For those members that have more time, Wednesday and Thursday mornings see our groups meet to improve, repair and modify our exhibition layouts, or carry out work on the clubhouse.

The club has N, 00 and O Gauge layouts plus a circular test track room for checking out your locos. It also has a wide selection of club locos and rolling stock for any member to use.

Our members have a wide range of abilities within railway modelling, for example making scenery, laying tracks, painting, wiring and electronics. They also have many other interests beyond our club. This makes for a very diverse mix of characters and a great resource for new members to tap into.

As a club, we put on a large exhibition each year to showcase the hobby and to raise funds. In 2024, at Oakgrove School in Milton Keynes, we welcomed over 500 people to our exhibition which featured over 30 model railway layouts and traders. If you search YouTube with "Silverfox Exhibition 2024" you will find a couple of videos provided by regular YouTubers.

If you like the idea of railway modelling, maybe resurrecting a past hobby or looking to start a new interest, please do get in touch with us.

New members are always welcome, and we invite you to come along for a free, no obligation visit to see how railway modelling technology has changed in recent times; you will be amazed!

An Update From Callum Anderson

Hello!

As I am writing this piece for the Tingewick newsletter, I am sat in my constituency office - which is a rare midweek treat. It's February recess, which means that Parliament is on a break, and I get to focus on the best part of the job – meeting local people and listening to how we can make local lives better.

Buckingham and Bletchley is a big constituency, and it's always a bit of a balance to make sure I get across all of the rural and urban areas of our patch. This week's focus has been getting out and about in the villages I represent.

I've spent the day at Tudor Farm and Harper Hill Farm to hear perspectives on national agricultural policy, as well as how HS2 works are affecting our farmland. In addition, I'm speaking with staff from the Thames Valley Police to gain a greater understanding of what resources they need to tackle rural crime, and I am meeting various parish councils to receive an update on their flood alleviation schemes.

I value being available and visible to my constituents wherever they live - and that I will take those views back to Westminster with me as I fight for our interests there.


Speaking of Westminster, I'm proud to have voted for pieces of legislation that will directly make local people's lives better. Since the new year, I have voted in favour of the Water (Special Measures) Bill to clean up our rivers and streams, the Border Security and Asylum Bill to crack down on people-smuggling gangs, and the Armed Forces Commissioner Bill to create an independent commissioner to scrutinise how our Government treats our service personnel.

This is just the beginning. It will take time, but things are getting better. I am sure everyone in Tingewick agrees with me that the recent news of an extra two million NHS appointments added since last July is very welcomed indeed.

NOTES FROM PUBLIC MEETING

Finmere Village Hall, Monday 17th February 7.30pm

APOLOGIES (31) PRESENT (55)

LEADING Michael Geelan (MG), Andy Plumbly (AP)

WELCOME

MG thanked and welcomed those attending and outlined briefly the extent of activity since the initial public meeting in August 2024

- over 1K emails,
- getting to grips with the workings of a Community Business Society,
- visiting other community-owned pubs to research various operating models,
- drafting and reworking many times the elements of a proposed business plan,
- and familiarising with the language of banks, surveyors and solicitors.

MG outlined the timeline of negotiations with Fullers/Fleurets (estate agent), the nomination of Asset of Community Value (ACV) status for the pub, and communication with the developer whose offer was briefly accepted in preference to that of the Red Lion Community Group (RLCG).

PRESENTATION

AP presented a summary of the Business Plan and Share Offer (slides attached) before taking questions.

Q&A

The majority of questions asked are answered in the Business Plan. Discussion centred around the following issues:

Fundraising & upfront costs

This starts now! March 31st has been set as the provisional closing date for the initial share offer. Consideration may be given to a loan to bridge a small funding gap should the need arise. Should the fundraising fall significantly short of the target, initial costs of around £10k (surveyor & solicitor fees etc) would be shared proportionally between investors.

Refurbishment costs & survey

Until the survey is completed there has to be an element of estimation but figures for the repair of the thatch have been quoted. A full structural survey, with a request to look closely at the issue of damp, is currently scheduled for March 10th. Any reordering of the internal space will be carefully considered.

Tenant

The pub would be managed by a tenant not the committee! Industry expertise is key in the success of the pub and, while the management committee will ensure that the needs of the community are fulfilled in the heads of terms (the key areas of the contract with the tenant), the tenant will be responsible for running the business. Assistance with recruitment of a suitable tenant has been offered by the head of a large hospitality group.

Attaining and sustaining footfall numbers

It will be tough! The community will need to support the pub by going, spreading word and bringing visitors. The tenant will have a responsibility for marketing the business via social media and other routes. And the management committee will need to work with the tenant to create an attractive offering (drink, food, atmosphere) and maximise on marketing opportunities. Mention was made of various social groups to which it would appeal, including cyclists, walkers, HS2 workers etc.

Provision of food and drink

Ultimately the nature of food and drink provision will be the responsibility of the tenant. An initial offering of a limited but high quality lunch menu, and evening food provided through a variety of food vans is suggested. The cost of hiring a chef and upgrading the kitchen is probably prohibitive initially. The selection of drinks (beers and wines) will be the tenant's.

John McLaughlin, representative of the local branch of CAMRA, confirmed that this model is widely and successfully used by other community/independent pubs.

Other local pubs

The Queen's Head @ Chackmore was cited as a successful model from which to learn.

The Royal Oak @ Tingewick has been given ACV status but no community bid has been put forward. The view is that it is unlikely to ever reopen as a pub.

Publicity

Lack of awareness of the campaign and the meeting specifically was raised – not everyone is on Facebook. Additional routes for publicity are being explored (press – online and printed, local radio, leaflet drop in Finmere, Tingewick and surrounding villages, as well as use of village noticeboards, village halls etc.

MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 22nd JANUARY 2025 AT 7.00PM

1. Apologies

2. Declarations of Interest

3. To approve minutes of the meeting held on 27.11.24

It was proposed that the minutes be approved as a true and accurate record.

4. Matters arising for information and reports only

5. Buckinghamshire Councilors' Reports

Cllr Fealey provided an oral report.

- a. The issue at Stowe View has now been resolved.
- b. Some council elections are being postponed, however the elections in Buckinghamshire will go ahead, given that it is already a unitary authority.
- c. Issues have arisen regarding the NPPF (National Planning Policy Framework) and the challenges that have been made to the greenbelt.
- d. Over the period of the NPPF the government is expecting 90,000 houses to be built in Buckinghamshire and there may be a possible new town with 10,000 additional houses. The Parish Council will be updated once further information is available.
- e. Buckinghamshire Council has been given authority to install cameras to monitor moving traffic offices (Padbury, Buckingham).
- f. There is an opportunity to apply for a free defibrillator. The Parish Council considers that one will be appropriate for the recreation field. Cllr Fealey to provide information to the clerk.
- g. National Lottery Community Fund is available.

Cllr Hornsey asked why we have been refused reimbursement for the money spent on the emergency flooding in 2023. A promise was made that we would be reimbursed and over a year later

we have been told that it will not be refunded. Cllr Fealey will support Cllr Hornsey to take this higher.

It was noted that Tingewick's flood committee was asked to advise a team of residents in Buckingham on how to move forward with establishing a flood group.

6. Planning

No planning applications for consideration this month.

It was noted that the planning application at the Firs has been withdrawn.

8. Budget

The Clerk presented a draft budget for discussion. The following were noted.

Village Maintenance Contract

Cllrs Rennie, Cllr Pearson and Cllr Hornsey will review what the Parish Council expects from the contract and report.

Action: Cllr Rennie, Cllr Hornsey, Cllr Pearson

Devolved Services

Cllr Rennie has made enquiries with CGM (current contractor). The Parish Council has been advised that it can enter into a contract for the devolved services four years on the basis that in year 1 there will be no cost increase and in years 2, 3 and 4 the increase would be fixed at 4% per year. Alternatively, there could be an annual contract that would increase at RPI which can be between 2% and 10%.

It was proposed that the Parish Council enter into a 4 year contract with no rise in year one and a 4% rise thereafter as opposed to RPI to provide for certainty.

Rec Grass Cutting

The contractor is increasing their fees to £125 per cut, further discussion will be undertaken.

9. Precept

It was proposed that a precept request be made in the sum of £42,000 Proposed: Cllr Newman Seconded: Cllr Pearson Approved

10. Councilors Reports and Items for Future Agenda

Lighting and Defibrillator-Cllr Hornsey

The lights have been checked and are in working order. There is some cutting back to clear obscured lights which Cllr Hornsey has arranged to be cut back.

The defibrillator is in good order.

Footpaths, Footways, Highways and Street Furniture-Cllr Maxwell

Anglian Water will be making repairs to Main Street in March and have requested a closure of Main Street for three days.

The outstanding list of repairs is shorter than it was, however, the ones older than one year will be re reported.

Concern raised that some have been closed on the system as repaired, when they haven't been. They will be re reported.

Pond and Special Projects-Cllr Newman

Cllr Newman sought clarification as to the cost incurred to date and the balance available.

The pond committee will be meeting 23.01.25 and will consider the information board and the moles.

Recreation Ground Play Area - Cllr Rennie

All in order.

School Playground - Cllr Hornsey

All in order.

Cemetery - Cllr Newman

Cllr Newman will take over responsibility for the cemetery.

11. The Red Lion and The Royal Oak

The Parish Council's nominations for the Red Lion and The Royal Oak to be registered as Assets of Community Value (ACV) were accepted by Buckinghamshire Council and they have accordingly been registered.

<u>The Red Lion</u> – An intention to sell has been lodged by the owner and the Red Lion Community Group have submitted their intention to bid for it.

<u>The Royal Oak</u> – An intention to sell has been registered by the owner. This means that any community group that would wish to purchase the property can express their interest but must do so and complete the paperwork, with 6 weeks of 10th January 2025. Cllr Hornsey has notified the village via Facebook. Time is limited to establish a group and issue an intention to bid. A group would need to have the skill and expertise to formulate the bid and then to arrange its running/management.

The Parish Council has investigated funding, and it could obtain funding, but it would be by way of a large loan and a separate company would need to be formed. The Parish Councilors do not feel that they have the necessary skill or experience to do this, and they question the financial viability of such a venture, that would expose the Parish Council should a loan be obtained. The Parish Council will support any community group that wishes to bid.

12. Tree on the Triangle

A resident has offered to contribute to a tree on the Triangle. Cllr Hornsey has made enquiries as to a suitable tree. To purchase the tree, plant it and erect a suitable barrier will be in the region of £500. Cllr Hornsey will liaise with the resident, and it was agreed that the Parish Council will meet the balance.






