I should just like to thank the kind people who called me to ask if they could help us at Diamonds, we were very grateful for the kind interest and I felt pretty mean when I said that we didn't need any help.

I know we are a group in our 60s, 70s and 80s but thankfully we are very fit and able at the moment – just to put you in the picture!

I am 84 and my neighbour, Anna, is 77 and we have run the successful line dancing class in the village for the past 10 years. Another Diamonds member, June and some of her friends, started the Over Sixties Table Tennis club and this is also very popular.

As well as regular meetings, the Diamonds go to the theatre, we're booked for the pantomime again this year and we also have two coach trips a year.

The Diamonds was formed 11 years ago by Carol Thurlby, Doris Lake and Chris Carter with a grant of £100 from The Parish Council. Doris moved to be with her family in Hereford and Carol and Chris took over then, when Carol passed away suddenly in 2017, the members had to take over and continue her good work – but Carol did everything so it wasn't easy. We're still in business but we do need new members to enable the Diamonds to continue.

We meet the first Wednesday of every month in the Village Hall at 10am and we finish about 12 o'clock. We always have some form of entertainment such as a speaker, music or a quiz.

There must be quite a lot of people of this age group (60+) in the village so why not join us? It would be a great pity for this club to go the same way as so many others have.





Alert- Fake TV Licensing Refund Offers

Watch out for these fake TV Licensing emails.

We've seen a sharp increase in reports about fake TV Licensing emails claiming to offer refunds. The emails state that the refund cannot be processed due to "invalid account details". The links provided in the emails lead to phishing websites designed to steal personal and financial details.

Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information in case it's a scam. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.

Six Hate Crimes Recorded Every Day In Thames Valley

In early October, the Police launched the latest phase of the Hidden Harm campaign, this time asking everyone to open their eyes to hate crime.

A hate crime is any crime committed against a person which is perceived to be motivated by hostility or prejudice towards their:

- Race
- Religion
- Sexual orientation
- Disability
- Transgender identity

Hate crimes can take place anywhere, even online. They can include threats, intimidation, damage to property and physical attacks.

They can have serious long-term effects on people – emotionally, physically and financially. Last year at least six hate crimes were recorded every day in Thames Valley. No one should be targeted because of who they are, how they look or what they believe in. If you or someone you know has been a victim of hate crime, or if you have witnessed a hate crime, report it.

You can do this by contacting the police on 101 or 999 in an emergency. Or you can contact Victims First on 0300 1234 148 for confidential advice and support.

Firework Safety Advice

Having fireworks at home can be great fun, as long as they are used safely. Figures show more children rather than adults get hurt by fireworks. Over the past few years over 350 pre-school children, some only a year old, were treated in hospital for fireworks injuries. This advice from **FireService.co.uk** will help keep you safe and enjoy your fireworks display

Be safe not sorry

Fireworks are safe if you use them properly. If you're putting on a home display, you should follow some simple steps to make sure that everyone has a good time without getting hurt.

Keep kids safe with Fireworks & Sparklers

We want children to enjoy fireworks but they need to know that they can be dangerous if they are not used properly. Each year, over half of all firework injuries are suffered by children.

Did you know that **sparklers get five times hotter than cooking oil**? Sparklers are not toys and should never be given to a child under five. Never touch a spent sparkler and always dispose of in a bucket of sand or water

Where to buy

Don't cut corners just to save a few pounds. Always buy fireworks from a reputable shop to make sure that they conform to British Standards. This means that they should have BS 7114 written on the box. Whatever you do, don't buy fireworks from anywhere you're not sure about, such as the back of a van or from a temporary, unlicensed market stall.

What to buy

There are different categories of fireworks and some can only be bought by professionals. Members of the public can buy and set off most of the fireworks that come under Categories 1 to 3. These are fireworks that include those that you can use indoors, in your garden or at a display. Always read the packet carefully and make sure that the fireworks you buy are suitable for the place where you are going to set them off.

Setting them off

Only one person should be in charge of fireworks. If that's you, then make sure you take all the necessary precautions. Read the instructions in daylight and don't drink any alcohol until they've all been discharged. Make your preparations in advance, and in daylight.

On the night, you will need:

- A torch
- · A bucket or two of water or sand
- Eye protection and gloves
- · A bucket of soft earth to put fireworks in
- Suitable supports and launchers if you're setting off Catherine wheels or rockets.
- · A metal tin to hold your fireworks

REMEMBER: NEVER RETURN TO A LIT FIREWORK IF IT DOESN'T GO OFF AND KEEP ALL PETS INSIDE

WWI Centenary - The Silent Soldier Silhouette

You may have seen Silent Soldier Silhouettes appearing recently around the country, including one by Tingewick Pond.

The Royal British Legion launched these near life-sized Tommies in mid-2018 in remembrance of those who silently made it home from World War One – as well as those who didn't.

On the base of the solider is the phrase "Lest We Forget" which was first used in 1897 in a poem by Rudyard Kipling called "Recessional", which in turn is thought to be inspired by the phrases "lest thou forget" and "lest thou depart" in Deuteronomy (4:7-9). After the First World War the phrase was adopted for use on memorials, grave stones and became synonymous with Remembrance Day.

Tingewick has several events to commemorate the soldiers who did and didn't return and they all need your support – not only for the organisations that are putting on these events but also to ensure that the brave men who fought valiantly for our country are not forgotten

Interestingly, the term Tommy when used in relation to a soldier is known to have been used as far back as 1743! "Tommy" is thought to have been derived from the name Thomas Atkins which was apparently chosen by the Duke Of Wellington after he was inspired by a soldier's bravery but there is little proof of this.

It is known that the Germans, French and Commonwealth soldiers referred to British soldiers as "Tommies" during World War One, with the Germans shouting "Tommy" across no-mans-land when they needed to communicate with their enemy

Although the term is slowly dropping out of use, Private soldiers in the Parachute regiment are still referred to as "Toms" so the name still lives on 100 years later.

DRAFT Minutes of the Tingewick Parish Council meeting held on 04-10-2018 at 7.30pm.

Members of the public in attendance: 1

285 Apologies: District Councillor Patrick Fealey.

286 Declarations of Interest: Cllr Lightfoot declared an interest in item 291: 18/03337/ALB **287 Minutes**: To consider the approval of the minutes of the last meeting held on 06-09-2018.

Proposed: Cllr Maxwell Seconded: Cllr Fenemore Approved

288 County Councillor's Report

Cllr Clare advised that he has spoken with Lois Houghton-Brown about the trees in Gorrell Close and together they are trying to find a solution.

It is hoped the southern curb of the Tingewick Road roundabout will be tarmacked this week. Plans have been developed to not use traffic lights, instead using the southern curve and move the left-hand turn into Tingewick Road so it can only be accessed from the East side; meaning traffic would have to go down the A421 and turn around at the Gawcott Roundabout. Once this is closer to being confirmed, a map will be put out and dates will be announced but it will be at least another two weeks until then.

Cllr Clare passed on to the grounds crew, the comments from TPC and it made their week as it is not often they receive positive feedback; they were very appreciative.

Resurfacing of the A422 between Buckingham and Water Stratford Road has been completed. Cllr Maxwell reminded Cllr Clare of the street lights at Tingewick Roundabout that have been burning continuously for we months, he raised it with TFB and they advised it would be addressed on the next grass-cutting day, however it has not been done yet.

Cllr Clare advised that like the potholes recently, street lighting is now the common issue at BCC and it is next on his agenda of items to pick up on.

Cllr Hornsey advised that he received a complaint from a Tingewick resident about the amount of advertising signs appearing on the fence by the Tingewick roundabout.

Cllr Clare believes the fencing is part of the highways structure and as such would come under the Highways team, however if there is a grand swell of similar comments he is happy to look in to it further and if the resident who has lodged the complaint has a real concern about he is equally happy for Cllr Hornsey to pass on his email address for the resident to contact him directly. Cllr Lightfoot enquired as to the legality of bicycles hurtling through the village at great speed.

Cllr Clare advised that the speed is the same as it is for vehicles; however it is the responsibility of the rider to ride sensibly. If it is a persistent problem with weekend cycling events, the he suggests contacting the cycle club to lodge complaint.

Cllr MacGarvey added that if there are arrows for a cycling event, then it should be marshalled. Cllr Clare added that Gawcott PC have said something similar recently; he suggests if villages are finding it becoming more of a nuisance, then it should be raised locally, perhaps to the LAF, to release something locally to the clubs asking them to notify PC's when cycling events are on.
