

""Quack Quack and Happy Easter!

We haven't been on the pond much recently and perhaps you think we've gone on holiday somewhere like San Diego. We haven't though, we're simply flat out busy making our nests and laying our eggs. We're using many of the same



gardens that we love to return to every year but look out for us in your borders and shrubs as we may have chosen you to host us this season! We'd appreciate a saucer of water and a handful of food a few metres away if you'd be so kind just to keep us going. None of our little eggs have hatched yet (as of 15th April) but it really should all start any day now and so we're terribly egg-cited!"

The Duck Squad are ready with three hutches at their homes filled to welcome the ducklings and their new mothers. So that the total numbers of ducks can be kept under control it's a really good idea for us to catch the ducklings and look after them for a few weeks before the males and most of the females are taken to ponds elsewhere; feel free to ask for some if you'd like to start keeping ducks yourselves. The aim is to avoid overcrowding and to make sure that the ducks aren't all related to each other!

A special thanks to Nick from Acme Pest Control who has a cracking good time keeping poultry himself and to Cox Robinson too who have supported the ducks so much and donated loads of food over the years.

We've run out of money again! Thanks very much for your generosity last time we asked. Donations can we given to Nicole or Pete at The Old Thatch on Main Street.

You may contact the Duck Squad on 07875 603 008 or Nick on 07931 307 595 if you have eggs or ducklings in your garden or if you wish to be involved in the care of the Tingewick ducks and ducklings in any way at all. It's really so much easier to collect the ducks from a garden as soon as they've hatched and near impossible once they're on the pond so it would be great if you could let us know as soon as they start hatching so they can be looked after.

Scam Warning - Fake TV Licensing Emails

An ongoing TV Licensing phishing campaign, first identified by the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) in September 2018, continues to be reported to Action Fraud in high numbers. Fraudsters are sending the public fake TV Licensing emails that are designed to steal their personal and financial information. Since April 2018, Action Fraud has received over 900 crime reports with victim losses totalling more than £830,000.

How you can protect yourself:

Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails and never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details.

Don't assume a phone call or email is authentic, even if someone knows your basic details (such as your name or address). Remember, criminals can spoof phone numbers and email addresses to appear as companies you know and trust, such as TV Licensing.

Your bank will never call and ask you for your PIN, full banking password, or ask you to transfer money out of your account.

What to do if you've fallen victim:

Let your bank know as soon as possible and monitor your bank statements regularly for any unusual activity.

If you suspect your identity may have been stolen you can check your credit file quickly and easil online. Use a reputable service provider and follow up on any unexpected or suspicious results. If you have been a victim of fraud or cyber crime, report it to Action Fraud at actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.

Scam Warning - Fake Virgin Media Emails

Fraudsters send fake Virgin Media emails threatening "automatic disconnection"

Action Fraud has received over 100 reports about fake emails that purport to be from Virgin Medi The emails threaten the recipient with "automatic disconnection" due to "invalid billing information The links in the emails lead to genuine-looking phishing websites that are designed to steal your Virgin Media account login details.

Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails, and never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details.

News from Water Stratford

WELCOME BACK

It was a delightful surprise to learn that Howard and Judy would be returning to the village: long-standing residents remember when they were active in village life some years ago. We welcome them back warmly and hope they feel at home here straight away.

GOODBYE

Sadly we say goodbye to Johan and Anna-Lena. It has been good to have them joining in village activities and we hope they take happy memories of English life back with them to Sweden.

VESTRY MEETING AND ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

These meetings, a legal requirement, took place in The Old School on 8th April. At the first, Mike and Guy were re-elected as churchwardens. At the second, reports on the year's activities were presented and Chris, Di and Nicky appointed members of the Parochial Church Council.

During the year, sixteen services have been held, of a variety of kinds: 'themed' services continue to attract more people than Communion services, so the proportion of the latter has been reduced. New this year were a modern 'Bread and Beer' version of the traditional Lammas ('loaf mass') and the Young Farmers' Carol Service. Thanks were expressed to Revd Liz and others who put thought and creativity into service preparation, and also to Sara and others for providing the music which contributes so much to worship. As a small parish we benefit from being part of a larger group: services are available at different times in the other five churches, and at benefice level activities such as Toddler Church and the Benefice Choir can be offered.

A wrought iron fence has been erected to make the churchyard safer and a dying hedge at The Old School has been removed – residents are to be consulted about its replacement. The PCC are most grateful to Deborah for her work in securing bookings at The Old School. A Bridge Evening was last year's major fund-raising event; this year it is hoped to re-instate the Duck Race. The many contributions of time and money made to further the church's work are greatly appreciated – it couldn't continue without them.

The PCC continues to be grateful to Sarah and her excellent team of cleaners and flower arrangers, who keep St Giles a pleasant place for congregations and also, importantly, for visitors – some of these come at times of personal distress, and many write thanks for an unlocked church. Another team (but with some duplication!), led by Chris, delivers 'The Link' around the village, with some issues posted further afield; the PCC thanks them for their help in keeping contact with parishioners. In addition, our country churches are sought by people from outside the parishes for weddings, baptisms and funerals, and often these people return to the churches when visiting family. In these and other ways, our work for the church reaches further than we sometimes realize.

364 County Councillor's Report

Regarding the right of way sign that was recently moved along Main Street; Cllr Clare has forwarded the clerks email to his colleague at BCC who is most appropriate to assist.

Tingewick road roundabout; Anglian Water had said it would be another 8 weeks, that has been reduced, works 11th and 12th April, then final works overnight 17th April to morning of 18th. Following that the developer will be back on site from 19th April with around 4 weeks of work to be phased.

The road by Lidl in Lace Hill is now open. The new development opposite Lidl is soon to be started. Gorrell Lane; Cllr Clare has forwarded Cllr Newman's email to the appropriate department at BCC to see if the sideways can be restructured, he worries that it will be a long project requiring investment. Fly-tipping was reported on Lenborough / Thornborough bridges. Cllr Clare will be joining a litter pick this weekend with other residents and they hope to get most of it then, though he noted it was an outrageous amount of rubbish. BCC have the best rate of response to flytipping.

One of the recent changes to the Household Recycling Centre is that it is now open 7 days a week. **365 District Councillor's Report:**

Council tax has been sorted and all residents should have received their notices.

The matter of the Unitary Authority is huge on the AVDC agenda, Cllr Fealey had just come from a meeting about putting forward the views of Parish Councils and Clerks, of which 80% are not in favour of one Unitary and would rather two due to the difference between north and south Bucks. Moving forward, working on a shadow system. A Statutory Change Order has been placed before parliament, to be debated, for changes in Bucks; it will then go to the House of Lords. Elections will be held 7th May 2020.

It will be a number of years before everything is finalised for the Unitary Authority.

Good news; exchange in Aylesbury town centre is now open. Fantastic public spaces.

Won gold award for digital transformation, using Artificial Intelligence to communicate with council. New homes bonus; micro grants increased from £2000. Awarded every month for small schemes. Running for six years from when new homes are occupied, Tingewick eligible because of Bovis. Inter-faith network, following in the aftermath of the tragedy in New Zealand, AVDC felt it important to open links up with the Muslim community.

New Unitary Authority will be looking at pushing services down to Parishes; Cllr Fealey suggested that TPC may want to look at devolving services and he recommends consideration be given to combining with other Parishes nearby.

Planning; Back Lane PIP only second PIP ever in AVDC and is the cause of a complaint at the moment, by the applicant, that it taking so long.

There is a huge amount of work going through AVDC, Cllr Fealey met with planning partners this morning, they have advised that they are nearly up to speed on the number of staff but are going through a learning curve. There has been a backlog; a team of consultants were brought in to help but two Senior Planner positions are still missing so it is causing a bottleneck.

575 planning requests have come in, which is up by about 100 on previous months. AVDC have employed two more Enforcement Officers and a Senior Enforcement Officer who are working on the backlog but an indicator of timescale cannot be given due to the planning process.

366 Matters Arising:

• Item 262 – District Councillors Report, 20 mile per hour speed limit near the school.

It was felt that the cost is too high and alternative signage will be explored.

Cllr Hornsey confirmed he has placed the MVAS in front of the village shop facing traffic approaching from the Buckingham end of Main Street.

Cllr Lightfoot obtained information for lights on the existing School signs, however it was agreed that they were not what the TPC wanted and the installation cost was rather high.

• Open Forum – December 2018: Pinch-Point

It was suggested to have a small roundabout (like the one near the pond) at the junction of Tollgate Street instead of the pinch-point being repositioned there.

It was suggested that the white gates be moved further outward to encompass Tingewick Park. Clerk has contacted BCC and is awaiting a response about the pinch-point.

Upon further consideration, it was agreed that the white gates are in the right spot but they could use a new coat of paint to refresh them, when the weather dries up.

Action: Clerk to again contact BCC about possible new roundabout. Action: Cllr Lightfoot to obtain paint and contact Clerk to help paint the gates.

• Item 321 – Councillors Reports, Cllr Hornsey: School Playground wet-pour surface Small area believed to be weakened by a sunken tree root.
